 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8. 	Animals must be clean and housed with clean bedding and fresh water. All animal exhibitors are expected to do their share of herdsmanship duties every day of the fair. Primary care of animals, pens, and general barn area needs to be completed each day, by the 4-H member. 4-H wants to make the best impression on the public, so animal and barn care needs to continue throughout each day. Exhibitors will not work with animals other than their own without permission from owner of animal. Exhibitors are expected to furnish their own animal feed and equipment. Equipment owned by a club or 4-H Leaders needs to be returned to its designated place after each use. Exhibitors will do their own work with minimal assistance from parents. 4-H Leaders & older youth may assist younger members as necessary. I realize that I am responsible for: • The proper, primary care and humane treatment of my animals. • The production of wholesome food if my exhibit animal is designated for market. • Assuming all disease transmission risks from comingling animals and then taking them home. • Follow the 4-H Dress Code by wearing appropriate show attire. • The development of sound moral character in myself. All animal exhibitors should read, understand and submit to the Extension office, a signed copy of the Meadowlark District Code of Show Ring Ethics. This only has to be completed once in your 4-H career.
