HEART — Act with integrity and accountability, and help others become their best.

HANDS — Put the needs of the community before those of themselves, and serve others.

HEALTH — Actively take care of their minds and bodies.



How does 4-H work? Join a club!

4-H clubs are group of families/volunteers who generally meet monthly. These meetings give youth opportunities to share their project work (speak), plan community service activities, and practice running meetings. They have many "sub-clubs" for individual projects, led by adults or teens within the club.

Undertake projects.

Members choose from a wide range of individual projects, based on their interests and the availability of a knowledgeable adult in the community to serve as a mentor/leader (matching facilitated through clubs). Through these projects, members set goals, learn the skills needed to achieve goals, and exhibit/demonstrate their skills at events like county fairs, speaking contests and other competitions.
